## Consultants' Recommendation for the Principals and Negotiators in the Alberta Health and Alberta Medical Association Negotiations

March 13, 2013

Re: Dispute Resolution for Changes in Compensation for Insured Services Provided by Physicians

The consultants recommend that if Alberta Health and the Alberta Medical Association cannot reach agreement through negotiations on the financial elements of the contract (i.e., the rates and prices paid to physicians for the delivery of insured health care services) that the parties submit to final offer, interest-based arbitration. The consultants recommend that the arbitrator be asked to decide on:

- 1) the percentage change for the years 2010/2011/2012/2013; and
- 2) whether the negotiated change is a set percentage with financial targets by section and/or code, or a global rate increase with allocation of the negotiated increase through a joint compensation committee.

In this arbitration process, both Alberta Health and the Alberta Medical Association would table what is in their view the most reasonable change in compensation for insured services provided by the physicians, the rationale justifying the percentage change, and why it should be a set percentage with financial targets or allocated through a joint compensation committee. The arbitrator would then choose one of the parties' proposals.
