


CMA:

Alberta Medical Association

The AMA's governing structure invites member involvement at many levels.

Representative Forum

The Representative Forum (RF) is the ultimate authority of the association and is responsible for providing direction to the Board of Directors.

The RF has over 130 physician members representing sections of medicine, provincial zones, AMA past presidents, the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta, the universities, Professional Association of Resident Physicians of Alberta (PARA) and students. PARA has two representatives who are voting members of RF. RF representatives are elected or appointed by their respective organizations. Two student representatives, one from each medical school, are eligible to attend RF and have voting privileges.

Board of Directors

The board develops and implements policy, advised by the RF, and works to achieve its objectives.

The 10 directors are elected by, and from, the members of the RF.

Officers of the Board of Directors include the president, president-elect and immediate past president. The general membership elects the president-elect, who goes on to become president and then immediate past president. Each term is for one year.

A student representative is an observer (non voting) at board meetings.

The AMA Committee on Student Affairs

The Committee on Student Affairs advises the board and RF on issues affecting student members. The committee is responsible for:
