Primary Care Networks and Family Doctors:

Prescription refills:

Evacuees who have personal identification and a means to pay can:

Visit any community pharmacy and have their prescriptions looked up online through Netcare

Evacuees without personal identification should visit an evacuation centre:

Medical staff or pharmacists will assess patients, prescribe and/or dispense necessary medications or provide a bridging prescription, with directions to community pharmacies that can assist them

Emergency Departments:
