## **★** Primary care activities update

The Alberta Medical Association's (AMA's) GPRWG recently met to determine which areas within the

AMA's Tactical Plan on Primary and Chronic Care are most consistent with the agreement in principle and will support the AMA's commitment to work with the Alberta Government to improve access and care for Albertans.

The following activities/priorities were identified:

- Allowing physicians to better use available technology to improve access to care, enhance communication and improve efficiencies
- Addressing over-crowding and resulting stress on Alberta's emergency rooms with an after-hours care modifier to serve as an incentive for physicians to keep their private practices open longer
- Enhancing the ability of physicians to use expanded health care teams by removing Schedule of Medical Benefits rules that provide a disincentive for physicians in the use of expanded teams
- Providing ongoing support to physicians to either develop or maintain validated patient lists

We are creating implementation plans for the activities/ priorities above. Stay tuned for more information.

# \* PCN continuance and AHW Grant Funding Agreement

The PCN Physician Lead Executive and AMA senior staff recently met to discuss the request from the

Ministry of Health and Wellness for Non-Profit Corporation (NPC) signature of a Grant Funding Agreement by April 30. The AMA received lots of feedback from PCN physicians on the details of the Grant Funding Agreement as well as the unilateral nature with which it was done.

Following the discussion, an urgent meeting with Alberta Health and Wellness (AHW) senior staff, Dr. Allan L. Bailey (Co-chair, PCN Physician Leads Executive) and AMA staff was held to clarify key issues and questions raised by a number of physicians. These included, but were not limited to, whether the existing rules and established trilateral processes remain unchanged and whether this new Grant Funding Agreement gives AHW the ability to unilaterally approve PCN business plans. Early suggestions indicated the process was an interim measure to continue the flow of PCN funds while the Trilateral Master Agreement is being negotiated; however, your executive needed explicit confirmation of that to ensure the best interests of all NPCs is being considered.

Outcomes of the meeting offered the following confirmations:

- Funding for the April payment to the NPCs would flow whether the Grant Funding Agreement was signed by April 30 or not.
- The deadline to sign the Grant Funding Agreement has been extended to May 16 to allow the parties time to get written clarification on the issues.
- Communication will go to each of the NPCs clarifying the purpose of the Grant Funding Agreement as well as clarifying those issues identified by physicians.

The PCN Physician Lead Executive met May 6 to discuss the implications for NPCs relating to the Grant Funding Agreement and will communicate their recommendation to all NPCs following their discussion.

#### \* Evolution of PCNs

The PCN Physician Leads Executive met on Friday, May 6 to further discuss the evolution of PCNs. The executive will review the goals/objectives of PCNs and primary care going forward. Specifically, they will consider short, medium and long term strategies for primary care.
