The AMA is dedicated to student development and allocates an annual budget to support student-run initiatives targeted at career advancement of medical students. All Alberta-based medical students are eligible to apply.	The AMA, CMA and its subsidiaries – MD Financial Management and Joule – allocate funds to support a grant program for health advocacy initiatives. All Alberta-based medical students and resident physicians are eligible to apply.
Objective: Support for initiatives organized by medical students for medical students	Objective: Support for health promotion projects led by medical students and residents that target subsets of the general population (i.e., target is not the medical profession)
Deadline: Typically end of March	Deadline: Typically the first week of November
Amount: Maximum \$5,000 per event	Amount: Minimum \$500 per grant
