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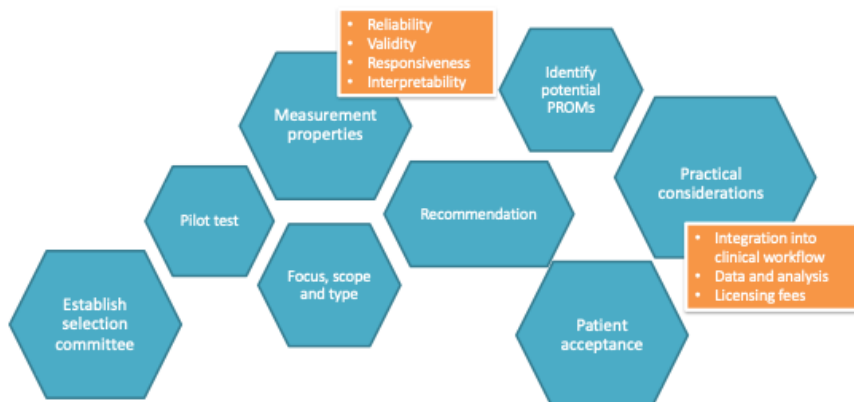

### Selecting appropriate patient reported outcome measures (PROMs)

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## Process for selecting PROMs



A key step in using PROMs in health systems is selecting the appropriate measure(s). Considerations include the purpose for collection and context of the clinical setting. However, the availability of many PROMs makes this choice rather challenging.

Our proposed approach includes the following steps:

- **Establish PROMs selection committee**
- **Identify the focus, scope, and type of measurement**
- **Identify potential PROM(s)**
- **Review practical considerations for each of the identified PROMs**
- **Review measurement properties of shortlisted PROMs**
- **Review patient acceptance of shortlisted PROMs**
- **Recommend PROM(s)**
- **Pilot the selected PROM(s)**

This is an iterative process. Each of these considerations has a different weight depending on the clinical context, patient population(s) and availability of supporting resources. The selection of appropriate PROMs is one step in the successful implementation of PROMs within health systems.
